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# 1. Introduction and Risk Assessment

As an academy we have opened our doors to all children and staff from September 2020, this has been based on Government Guidance released from 2 July 2020 to date and the needs and requirements of the academy for staff to support children and our operation of serving the community. As the nation has now entered national lockdown we are now open for the children designated as vulnerable and key workers, thus reducing the number of children attending the academy and we are moving to remote learning. We anticipate we will have up to 105 primary aged children on site and 25 adults on site. We are operating Year/classroom bubbles as the number of children attending the academy has reduced and Clinically Extremely Vulnerable children and staff are not to attend the academy. Staff and union representatives have been consulted on this document and it is shared with parents for comment via our website.

#### **Extracts from Government Guidance**

During the period of national lockdown, schools, alternative provision (AP), special schools, colleges and wraparound childcare and other out-of-school activities for children should allow only vulnerable children and young people and the children of critical workers to attend (recognising that the characteristics of the cohorts in special schools and alternative provision will mean these settings continue to offer face to face provision for all children, where appropriate). All other children and students should not attend and should learn remotely until February half term.

As an academy, we are mindful of the need for:

### System of controls

This is the set of actions the academy must take. They are grouped into 'prevention' and 'response to any infection' and are outlined in more detail below.

#### **Prevention:**

- 1) minimise contact with individuals who are unwell by ensuring that those who have coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms, or who have someone in their household who does, do not attend school
- 2) clean hands thoroughly more often than usual
- 3) ensure good respiratory hygiene by promoting the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach
- 4) introduce enhanced cleaning, including cleaning frequently touched surfaces often, using standard products such as detergents and bleach
- 5) minimise contact between individuals and maintain social distancing wherever possible
- 6) where necessary, wear appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE)

Numbers 1 to 4 must be in place in all schools, all the time.

Number 5 must be properly considered and the academy will put in place measures that suit our particular circumstances.

Number 6 applies in specific circumstances.

## Response to any infection

- 7) engage with the NHS Test and Trace process
- 8) manage confirmed cases of coronavirus (COVID-19) amongst the school community
- 9) contain any outbreak by following local health protection team advice

Numbers 7 to 9 must be followed in every case where they are relevant.

### Risk Assessment

The **purpose** of this **risk assessment** is to ensure that the academy is safe to work in and to attend by all individuals thus ensuring they are appropriately protected from hazards. The process of a **risk assessment** involves firstly identifying hazards within the academy, and then subsequently implementing control measures.

We have used the concept "As Low As Reasonably Practicable (ALARP)", to ensure we have considered all available Government and sector guidance. Where children do not have the capacity to adhere to the stringent social distancing we are encouraging parental support and we may need to consider supporting them with remote learning.

This document will be read in conjunction with the Operational Plan by staff, which provides detail on how risk management will be supported operationally. The operational plan provides a detailed guide in ensuring that all latest government guidance is outlined and met appropriately. Any changes to the operational plan in line with latest guidance is shared with staff and actions communicated with parents and children regularly. Only the risk assessment will be shared on the school website as the operational plan includes reference to specific staff members.
