Year 3 have displayed the value and skill of **Creativity** in the following ways:

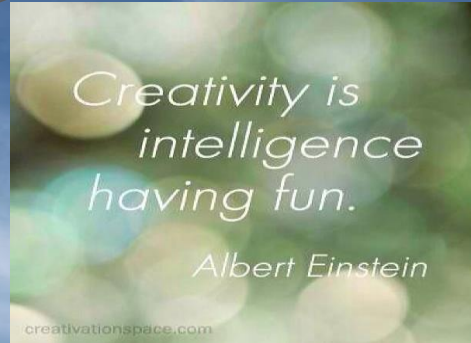

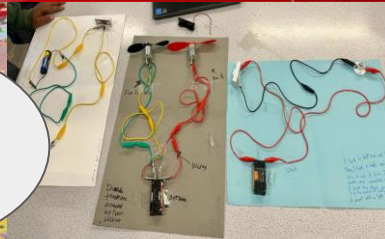
